## **Eligibility**

Washington State Public School personnel directly involved in either Running Start or Tech Prep can apply for this scholarship.

## **Selection Process**

Completed applications will be considered on a **first come, first served** basis. A sub-committee of the Conference Planning Committee will review applications.

## **Application Process**

Scholarships will be in the form of fund transfers for the conference registration fee of \$100.
